BoneKEy Introduces New Article Types

March sees some changes to the content published in *BoneKEy*. Two new article types are now open for submissions: Clinical Cases and Laboratory Methods.

Clinical Cases: A report, which describes the findings, clinical course, and prognosis of a case. These will be published within the *BoneKEy* Knowledge Environment.

Laboratory Methods: Step-by-step descriptions of procedures which users can take to the laboratory or clinic and immediately apply in their own research. These will be published in *BoneKEy Reports*.

March will also see another important change as Commentaries will move to be published in *BoneKEy Reports*. These will be replaced in the open Knowledge Environment by *BoneKEy Watch*, our popular research highlights of the latest and most important bone research.

New European Medicines Agency Restrictions for Strontium Ranelate (Protos)

New findings from the European Medicines Agency indicate that treatment with Protos (Strontium Ranelate) is associated with an increased risk of cardiovascular events. Recent changes to the PBS listing for Protos, restricting it to men and women with severe osteoporosis and a high risk of fracture, are consistent with the cardiovascular contra-indications stated in the revised 2013 product information.

In addition to its 2013 review, the European Medicines Agency has concluded a new analysis of the available clinical data on strontium ranelate. In a press release dated 21st February 2014, the agency recommends further restricting the medicine to patients who cannot be treated with other medicines approved for osteoporosis.

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) is itself currently reviewing the data in light of the European Medicines Agency's recommendations, and will make its own recommendations appropriate to the Australian setting.
